



## Temporary Distance Education and Potential Reciprocity Issues After Licensure

While most states have adopted temporary distance education measures in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, there are still a few who have not as of yet made the decision to allow distance education as a temporary solution. Please be advised that if you are planning to transfer your license to one of these states after graduation, you may run into an issue where your hours earned through distance education are not accepted and validated by another state. Below is the list of states who have not adopted a temporary measure to allow distance education as a result of the COVID19 pandemic:

Maine  
Mississippi  
Wyoming

While these are the only three states who have not fully adopted temporary distance education measures, other states may have temporary measures that are not the same as Texas which could affect your ability to transfer your license.
